REL-07.01.01	Show understanding that God reveals himself over time and in human history.
REL-07.01.02	State that God's revelation is divine revelation.
REL-07.01.03	Identify God's revelation as the foundation of our Christian faith.
REL-07.01.04	Show understanding that faith is a gift from God helping us to respond to His love for us.
REL-07.01.05	Describe how faith is both a personal relationship with God and a free assent to the truth God has revealed.
REL-07.01.06	State how the worshipping community is a public witness of faith.
REL-07.01.07	Describe how God is revealed through the human person and created world.
REL-07.01.08	Articulate that the central mystery of the Christian faith is the Holy Trinity: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

REL-07.01.10	Describe how the Holy Spirit worked through Mary to prepare the way for the Incarnation.
REL-07.02.01	State that the Catholic faith is one and the same everywhere yet is expressed uniquely in many cultures.
REL-07.02.02	Show understanding of the sacramental nature of the Church.
REL-07.02.03	Show understanding of the meaning of sacrament in personal life.
REL-07.02.04	Recognize that the sacramental life is rooted in faith and prayer.
REL-07.02.05	Recognize that the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders cannot be repeated because they give an indelible spiritual mark by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood.
REL-07.02.06	State that Baptism is the foundation of communion among all Christians.
REL-07.02.07	Recognize that the Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the sacraments of initiation, the elements of which are being sealed with the oil of chrism and the laying on of hands.
REL-07.02.08	State in the Sacrament of the Eucharist we receive Christ whole and entire under the forms of bread and wine.
REL-07.02.09	Through the sacrament of Penance the baptized obtain pardon through God's mercy for the offenses against him and are reconciled with the Church.
REL-07.02.10	State that the seal of confession cannot be broken under any circumstance.
REL-07.02.11	Describe how the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is intended for the seriously sick, elderly, and those in danger of death. It may be received more than once.
REL-07.02.12	State the elements and symbols of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.
REL-07.02.13	State that the oil of the sick is the oil used to anoint the person in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. It is different from the oils used at Baptism and Confirmation.
REL-07.02.14	State that the ministers of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick are bishops and priests and Catholics have the right to receive the sacrament when necessary.
REL-07.02.15	Show understanding that the Sacrament of Matrimony is a sacramental covenant.
REL-07.02.16	Describe the Sacrament of Matrimony as the matrimonial covenant by which a baptized man and a baptized woman, establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life and is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and procreation and education of children.
REL-07.02.17	Recognize the spouses are the ministers of the Sacrament of Matrimony through expression of the marriage vows.
REL-07.02.18	Recognize the Sacrament of Holy Orders as valid for men who are baptized, prepared through seminary education and called by the bishop to be ordained.
REL-07.02.19	State that there are three ranks or orders of priesthood: the episcopate, the presbyterate and the diaconate.
REL-07.02.20	Identify the priesthood as an apostolic call that comes from Jesus Christ commissioning the apostles to continue the work of the Church.
